
Income Breakdown - Geographic*










Grants Breakdown - Sector

Conclusions

Future grants to be spread across three strands:

- 1. A major project, probably in Africa, worthy of large, long-term support
- 2. Several grants/year to applicants in Aberdeenshire (up to £6,000 total)
- 3. Smaller annual grants to specific causes dear to Jo

JWT will also demonstrate:

- More ambition: Big target for fundraising in 2014: £20,000
- More transparency: Share strategy and annual report publicly
- More sources of fund-raising: To include setting up online shop
- More evaluation: Grant recipients to be contacted and surveyed to establish what works and what does not.
- More reach: We will consider establishing of 'Friends of JWT'
